2022-2023 Annual Report





Dear Parents, Students, and Stakeholders:

As the Head of School at Ohio Digital Learning School, I am proud to tell you about our school's mission and progress. The 2022-2023 school year was our Forth year of operation. We grew from 613 students to 1590 students by the end of the school year.

Ohio Digital Learning School is designated as a Dropout Prevention and Recovery School through the Ohio Department of Education. We serve students ages 16-21 who have fallen behind in credits or have experienced crises that have interfered with the success of their high school career. Our focus is helping students recover credits and overcome obstacles to successfully complete high school and be prepared for careers and college. We provide opportunities to recover credits through block scheduling and credit recovery courses. Students can take advantage of career counseling and exploration through weekly sessions and courses. We also provide targeted intervention to address learning gaps.

The 2022-2023 school year provided many opportunities to support our students academically and holistically. To meet the social emotional needs of our students, we implemented the Seven Mindsets curriculum into our Pathfinder Hour sessions and Homerooms. We continued our Homeroom Program daily to help build lasting relationships with staff and peers. Our Title 1 intervention program provided students with additional engagement and attendance support. At the end of the school year, 425 students made up Ohio Digital Learning School's graduating class of 2023. We could not be prouder of our graduates and our returning students.

We look forward to the upcoming 2023-2024 school year. Ohio Digital Learning School will continue to combine rigorous curriculum and instruction with wraparound supports to provide students with an opportunity to recover credits, engage in learning safely, and prepare for college and career.





#### **Student Demographics**

- Ohio Digital Learning School served students residing in over 693 different school districts across Ohio during the 2022-2023 school year.
- Ohio Digital Learning School's student population is between the ages of 16-21; 59% were between 16-17 and 41% were eighteen years or older.
- 21% of Ohio Digital Learning School students received special education services.
- During enrollment families are surveyed to estimate the length of time their student will attend the school. 75% indicated that they intended to attend more than one school year.








#### **Staff Demographics**
